Putting It Together

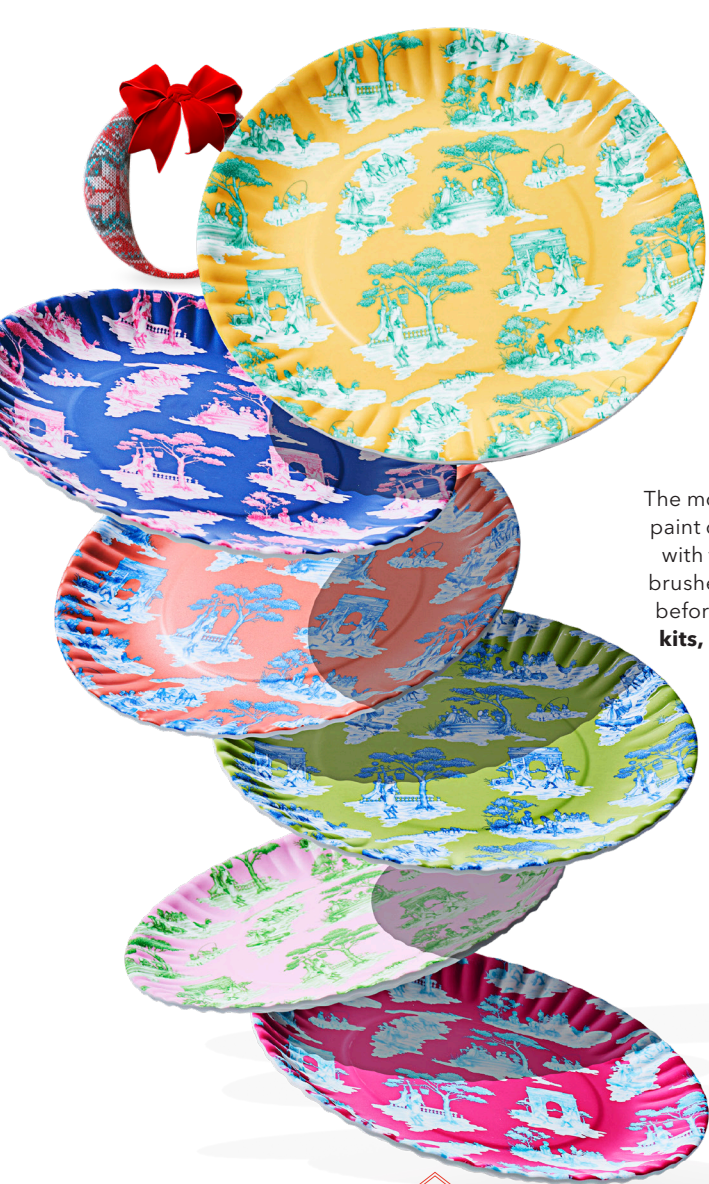
