"I CAME ACROSS THIS ROOM, IN THE HOME OF PATRICK GUFFRAZ, in a 1996 book by Herbert Ypma, *Paris Flea Market*. I am drawn to really saturated color, so the vermilion spoke to me. I also use a lot of classical furniture and love his settee here, with its embroidery showing vessels and the words *Je pense a mon jardin*. Guffraz called his style Art

Pauvre—it's the idea of mixing into a space things that aren't precious, like the gilt-wood sunburst and those lamps with the very simple paper shades.
